OPHTHALMOLOGY

CAREER OVERVIEW-

Ophthalmology, from its Greek origins, is literally the science of eyes. During its development as a medical specialty it has grown to encompass the skin around the eyes, the globe, the orbit, and the nervous connections in the brain all the way back to the visual cortex. Pathology in this system and the management of systemic diseases that affect the eye are in the remit of the ophthalmologist.



Ophthalmology is the medical and surgical management of conditions of the eye and its adnexa. Ophthalmology includes the full range of eye conditions in patients of all ages from unborn neonates/ directly through to the elderly. The extent of conditions experienced in ophthalmology is wide - trauma, waterfalls, diabetic eye illness, intrinsic and hereditary eye issues. The open door for sub-specialization is just as wide. A range of abilities, both therapeutic and surgical, are needed for ophthalmology.

An ophthalmologist is a medically trained doctor who commonly acts as both physician and surgeon. (S) He examines, diagnoses and treats diseases and injuries in and around the eye.
